

Minimum Renewable Energy From Waste Training Requirements

Each person will receive a Company Site Specific Induction prior to entry to site.

Training is only one component of competency. The Health and Safety Executive currently describes competency as *“the combination of training, skills, experience and knowledge that a person has and their ability to apply them to perform a task safely. Other factors, such as attitude and physical ability, can also affect someone’s competence”*

As a minimum to work on any construction site you must have either:

**CCNSG – ECITB or
OIRAC -TQUK or
CSCS + CITB* Health and Safety Awareness Course**

There may be task specific training such as Cat & Genny, Permits to Work, Work at Height, Harness, Confined Space, Face Fit Testing, Gas Monitoring, Vehicle Marshall, Banksman etc. These **MUST** be accompanied by the above.

Where a higher level qualification is held, the requirement for a lower level qualification may be waived, assuming the higher level qualification includes the contents of the lower (e.g Post-Grad Dip removes requirement for NEBOSH cert, Temporary Works Co-ordinator removes the requirement for Temporary Works Supervisor) if the employer approves.

Any and all SKILLED qualifications and certification to be forwarded to site in advance to be checked and approved prior to arrival. The EPC should have systems in place to assist in the quantifying of qualifications and certification.

Nominated First Aiders: One First Aider per 20 persons per company on site.

3 day First Aid at Work + Defibrillator

Additional Information

Banksman Definition – Any person specifically responsible for assisting in the movements of large plant vehicles.

Traffic Marshall – A person who is responsible for assisting and movements of all general site traffic.

Training standards must be satisfied before arriving on site. Personnel will not be allowed access to site until satisfactory evidence of training is provided.

It is recommended for contractors to check the training applicable for its workforce.

Some courses require a minimal number of attendees and translation services. Advanced planning is advised to avoid schedule delays.

Where an individual's responsibilities fall over one or more of roles defined, then the individual must ensure that they obtain the obligations/qualifications for all the roles they are fulfilling. Furthermore, where there is any overlap of similar obligations/qualifications, then the higher obligations/qualifications will be required.

On site, 5 day courses can be taken 1 day or 2 days per week by prior arrangement with the training provider over consecutive weeks if required.

Some training courses are available in contractor's home country and many training companies are able to provide courses outside of the UK. We will be pleased to advise you accordingly.
