COVID-19: business continuity, recovery and the new normal

During the pandemic, we prioritised business continuity support for our members and put together a log of issues raised by members and had regular calls with the Defra, Energy Minister, BEIS, Scottish Government and Senior level contact with all relevant Government Departments.

We set up a dedicated webpage and a member briefing note which was updated regularly. We took direct action on various issues including clarifying the waste sector as keyworkers, prioritising waste collections, propane contingency plans, feedstock supply, RHI Tariff Guarantees commissioning deadlines, technical competence, networking surplus food stuffs, HGV driver shortage and communicating regulatory positions.

THE REA STRATEGY

Over the past year, the REA has developed and published a comprehensive Strategy document, detailing how to deliver the UK's Net Zero goal and interim targets to get us there. In the Strategy, we have crystallised our view of how the UK can reach the Net Zero target, and how the REA can play a leading role in helping UK industry take the steps to reach this target. Our Strategy is divided into four pillars: circular bioresources, heat, power & flexibility, and transport. Each pillar has its own impact target based on the REA's analysis of what is necessary

The Organics Forum is under the Circular Bioresources pillar. Over the coming months, REA's Strategy will play a greater role in our organisational structure as we implement it with support from the REA Board and Policy Board who, along with REA staff, were instrumental in developing our Strategy document.





REA ACTIVITY

We have developed, and in August 2021 published, REA's policy on liners and re-purposed bags suitable for separate collection of targeted food waste streams from households, businesses and non-domestic premises in England. We also have Organics Scotland committee focused on issues specific to Scotland.

REA Organics works very closely with other member forums of the REA, especially REA Green Gas. We collaborate to ensure that Organics members are represented, and views considered when informing policy and working on our consultation responses which is often crosscutting.

REA has member Forums covering all things renewable energy and clean technology from Biomass, Green Gas, Energy from Waste, Finance, and Landfill Gas to Electric Vehicles, so if there is something else you are interested in, make sure you are signed up to the correct member forums.
