#### **Business Rates Update**

Positive news in Autumn Budget: "From 2023, the government will introduce exemptions for eligible plant and machinery used in onsite renewable energy generation and storage, and a new 100% relief for eligible heat networks, to support the decarbonisation of building."

However an on going consultation referring to administrative process remains Open and with some concern:

- Duty to Notify requirements are overbearing and extensive.
   REA will be calling for this process to be simplified and only require annually
- **Penalties are too penal.** Min. £300 for non compliance, with addition of £60/day. Plus 2% RV fine if there is a failure to notify of changes that would lead to increased RV.
- *Introduction of a 3-month challenge deadline* likely to lead to protective challenges.
- Lack of clarity on definition of low carbon sources in 100% relief for heat networks.
- Further guidance needed on onsite renewables relief implementation

Deadline for Response is 22<sup>nd</sup> February - REA to circulate draft in due course.



#### Costs of repowering and extending end of life solar

BEIS have commissioned Arup to develop a representative set of technical and costs ranges for use in levelised cost analysis.

Study to focus on Solar PV; Offshore Wind; Onshore Wind and Landfill Gas.

Particularly interested in the costs associated with repowering and extending life of projects.

Data to be anonymised and NDA's signed with Arup between respondents.

Questionnaire will be circulated, please do provide feedback as it remains an important evidence base for future policy decisions.

## Policy announcements

National Grid ESO currently conducting stakeholder engagement around Net Zero Market Reform.

Engagement exercise follows published conclusions from phase 2 of the Net Zero Market Reform project.

Earlier this week they ran two workshops focused on Operation and Investment in terms of future market design.

Reports are likely to prove influential in futuer market design and positions of a Futuer System Operator if that is to be established.

#### **Ongoing staffing issues related to Covid or BREXIT**

We continue to feed into BEIS and across Whitehall any issues concerning supply chain constraint's caused by Brexit or Covid issues.
