




18 industry experts elected across the UK. Advises on policy and direction




Boiler Upgrade Scheme

- The BUS supports the continued deployment of low carbon heat technologies
- Contributes towards the ambition of 600,000 heat pumps a year by 2028.
- The BUS has a budget of £450 million over three years from 2022-25
- From 23 October 2023, applications for ASHPs or GSHPs will be eligible for a higher grant value of £7,500.
- The BUS consultation closed on 12 October. We are currently considering responses and will publish the Government response in due course

Boiler Upgrade Scheme & biomass

- ASHP are suitable for most homes and will play an important strategic role in decarbonising existing properties.
- Biomass has a targeted role to play in the decarbonisation of heat for some off-gas-grid properties
- Support for biomass installations will only be in areas where heat pumps are not appropriate and where high standards for air quality are met.
- There is support for properties where heat pumps are not a viable option however the policy is to ensure these technologies are deployed in a targeted manner and therefore will not increase support for biomass boilers.
