General Election: What has happened?

- Friday 24 May Parliament was prorogued.
- "Purdah" the pre-election period of sensitivity begun. Government
 Ministers continue in their roles until the election. Major, new or
 controversial announcements cannot be made. Civil service withdraws from
 public engagement.
- Thursday 30 May Parliament was officially dissolved. MPs, if standing, are now on the same level as other Prospective Parliamentary Candidates.



General Election: What happens next?

- **Thursday 20 June** Question Time Leaders' special, with members of the panel facing topical questions from the audience.
- Wednesday 26 June head-to-head debate between Rishi Sunak and Sir Keir Starmer. This is set to be the last TV debate of the election campaign.
- Thursday 4 July Election day, followed by results and any coalition discussions if needed.
- Tuesday 9 July the new Parliament convenes.
- Wednesday 17 July the State Opening of Parliament and the King's Speech take place.



General Election: What has the REA done?

- We have analysed and responded publicly to the main parties' manifestoes.

- We will continue reaching out to PPCs is this something you can help us with?










